



2024 USTA Tri-Level League Regulations

GENERAL INFO

- All players must be current USTA Members.
- Gender Specific: Men's teams and Women's teams (No Mixed Gender Teams)
- USTA Colorado League Regulations apply for anything not covered in this document.

FORMAT

- Doubles Competition Only – No Singles
- Team matches will consist of one (1) doubles match per NTRP Level – **3.5, 4.0 & 4.5**
- Each line must have at least one (1) player in-level.
- All matches will be best of 3 tiebreak sets with a match tiebreak in lieu of a 3rd set. The Coman Tiebreak will **NOT** be used for any tiebreaks.

ADVANCEMENT

- Matches played will count toward players' year-end NTRP Rating.
- Players with the following rating types will be allowed to participate during the local league and the Section Invitational: Computer, Appealed, Tournament, Mixed, and Self-rated.
 - **NOTE: Only players with a valid computer rating will be eligible to advance to the Tri-Level National Invitational.**
- Eligibility to advance: A player must have played a minimum of two (2) matches, one of which may be a win by default, on the same team during the local league to be eligible to advance to the Tri-Level Section Invitational.
- The first-place team in each division (women's / men's) will advance to the Intermountain Section Invitational.
- The winner from the Intermountain Section Invitational will advance to the Tri-Level National Invitational.
- At the National Invitational, players may not play up NTRP levels unless there is an onsite injury or extenuating circumstances that require a team to play a player up a level to avoid defaulting a court.
